### ORCHID SOCIETY OF WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA ORCHID SHOW, MARCH 14-15, 2020 REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS AND SHOW SCHEDULE

- 1. Notice of intent to exhibit must be received by March 1, 2020. It should be sent to James Yamber, 380 Western Ave., Oakdale, PA 15071, or emailed to him at <a href="mailto:quaill@verizon.net">quaill@verizon.net</a>. Reasonable effort will be made to provide the space requested, but should it be necessary, the Show Committee reserves the right to limit the space allocated to any and all exhibitors.
- 2. The OSWP will furnish 6' high exhibit space dividers and backdrops in place. Exhibits should not extend above the backdrop. Nothing may be hung from the backdrops. Exhibitors must provide all other staging materials. An exhibit is a composition of plants arranged to their best advantage to contribute to the general beauty of the show. While there is no minimum number of plants, the materials must fill the space in an artistic manner and orchids must predominate.
- 3. No cut orchid flowers will be permitted in a flowering plant exhibit, and no flowering plants will be permitted in a cut flower exhibit. No plants in flower other than orchids will be permitted in any exhibit.
- 4. Single plants will be accepted for exhibition and judging. They may be placed in the society exhibit.
- 5. Exhibit classes are open to everyone except as otherwise noted in these Registration Instructions. All plants entered for Amateur judging must have been in the possession of the exhibitor on or before December 15, 2019. Amateurs may enter plants purchased on or after December 15, 2019 for Open judging.
- 6. An **Amateur** is defined as a person who sells no more than 100 orchid plants per year and is not a professional horticulturist. A **Novice exhibitor** is defined as an Amateur who has previously entered an exhibit in no more than three shows. A Novice may join with others and may have an experienced mentor.
- 7. Anyone selling plants from an area other than the OSWP's sales table must exhibit in the Open Division. Open exhibits must be a minimum of 25 sq. ft., except for international exhibitors who may enter a tabletop exhibit less than 25 sq. ft. (Class 4).
- 8. Exhibits may be set up from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM on Friday March 13, 2020. All plants and exhibits must be ready for judging by the end of day Friday, March 13, 2020.
- 9. **Registration** of plant and exhibit entries for judging will be from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Friday March 13, 2020. Exhibits must be entered in the appropriate class in order to be judged as an exhibit. Open classes printed on white paper and amateur classes printed on yellow paper. Registrants who are unable to make the registration cutoff can make prior arrangements with Dave Miller, Registrar at 330-307-7189 or demipasmil@aol.com to find a workable solution, otherwise no entries will be accepted after the cutoff. Unregistered plants may be placed in exhibits but are expected to be labeled.
- 10. ALL PLANTS MUST BE ENTERED IN THE LOWEST NUMBERED APPLICABLE CLASS. Plants may be entered in only a single class. Please ask for help at Registration if you are not sure in which class to enter a plant.
- 11. Species classes include natural hybrids.
- 12. All plants to be judged must be labeled by the exhibitor as to genus and species or hybrid name. Entry forms should identify mericlones, awarded plants, parentage and clone names if known.
- 13. An <u>intrageneric</u> hybrid has parents from more than one species but only one genus. An <u>intergeneric</u> hybrid has parents from more than one genus.
- 14. Judges will have the right to award or withhold any scheduled trophy or ribbon, and may subdivide any plant class when warranted. First, second and third place ribbons will be awarded for each class of plants and exhibits when considered merited by the judges.
- 15. Ribbons and trophies will be awarded separately for Amateur and Open plants and exhibits, unless otherwise indicated by these Registration Instructions. **Yellow entry forms must be used to enter a plant or exhibit for Amateur judging. White entry forms must be used to enter a plant or exhibit for Open judging.** Registration forms may be obtained in advance by contacting the registrar at 330-307-7189 or dcmjpasmil@aol.com. Please be advised that all registration forms must be printed on one-half letter size paper (5-1/2" x 8-1/2").
- 16. Unless clearly designated otherwise, every exhibited plant will be eligible for AOS awards, and exhibitors agree to complete AOS requirements for awarded plants
- 17. Entry tags should be removed from the exhibits and plants <u>after judging but before 3:00 PM</u> on Saturday March 14, 2020.
- 18. Hours for viewing the show will be:

Saturday, March 14, 2020 12:00 PM to 6:00 PM Sunday, March 15, 2020 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM

- 19. Neither the Orchid Society of Western Pennsylvania nor the Phipps Garden Center is responsible for the loss or damage to any plant, bloom, container, or other property of the exhibitor. However, precautions will be exercised for their safety.
- 20. All entries and displays must be left in place until 4:00 PM, Sunday, March 15, 2020. Entries and displays not removed by 6:00 PM, Sunday, March 15, 2020, will be disposed of by the Show Committee.
- 21. All questions regarding the interpretation or application of these Registration Instructions shall be referred to the Registrar and Show Chairpersons. All decisions of the Registrar and Show Chairpersons will be final.
